#### **DEFINITION:**

Under direct supervision of the Principal provide homework assistance to elementary school (K-8) grade students in Expanded Learning Program. Tutors provide one-on-one academic tutoring and educational group activities. Tutor may also provide structured sports activities and art projects for students.

### **QUALIFICATIONS:**

## Required:

- 1. Clear oral communication skills (customer service experience a plus)
- 2. Interest in any of the following: art, computer, recreation programming, etc.
- 3. Have reliable transportation or transportation plan.
- 4. Education that shows strong math skills up to the 7-8<sup>th</sup> grade and English language skills with writing, essays and the process of writing.

## Desired, but not required:

- 1. Experience working with children in an individual or group situation.
- 2. High School Diploma or equivalent.
- 3. Knowledge of elementary clerical procedures.

#### **KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITY:**

- 1. Knowledge of basic computers and software applications.
- 2. Knowledge of school supplies and equipment.
- 3. Ability to assist children in an academic environment with math, reading, and writing
- 4. Ability to work independently and with a team, and under deadlines
- 5. Ability to work with varied populations, such as teachers, parents and students
- 6. Ability to plan, design and implement study or homework plans on a weekly basis.
- 7. Ability to understand and follow oral and written instructions.
- 8. Ability to maintain a kindly and sympathetic attitude without emotional bias.
- 9. Ability to be familiar with the school's learning materials.
- 10. Ability to adapt to unusual physical or emotional conditions in a classroom or on a playground.
- 11. Ability to exercise independent thinking a good judgment at all times.
- 12. Ability to arrive on time.

#### **ESSENTIAL DUTIES/TASKS:**

- 1. Facilitate activities with groups of up to 10 students.
- 2. Provide home work assistance, tutoring, academic enrichment, and physical activity using curriculum provided by the school.
- 3. Assist with the supervision of all participants to ensure a safe and organized program.
- 4. Assist with the daily attendance records and gather participant information.
- 5. Work with teachers through e-mail and daily communication to identify academic needs of students in the Expanded Learning Program.
- 6. Supports Expanded Learning Program direction in expected behaviors.

- 7. Act as a positive role model.
- 8. Establishes a separate tutoring location from regular ASP activities to support a quiet and focused learning environment. This location is to be determined by the administration.
- 9. Organize appropriate schedule for tutoring small groups of students based on age and ability.
- 10. Provide one-on-one academic tutoring and educational group activities in the tutoring room.
- 11. Establishes goals, creates lists of students to work with and sets learning environment before the start of tutoring from 3:00-3:15.

## **NON ESSENTIAL DUTIES/TASKS:**

1. Does other duties as assigned.

## **ENVIRONMENT/WORK CONDITIONS:**

- Location: Work is performed 80% within the school classroom setting. 20% is an outdoor educational setting such as physical education, recess, walking, field trips.
- Hazards: May include slippery surfaces.
- **Equipment Used:** General office equipment, computer, 10-key, copier, sports equipment, outside equipment.
- Safety Equipment: None required.

#### **ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:**

(Constantly=Over 2/3 time, Frequently=1/3-2/3 time, Occasionally=Under 1/3 time, Seldom=Under 7% time)
PHYSICAL

- **Standing/Walking:** Frequently; throughout work shift while performing classroom duties, P.E. classes, recess supervision, field trips.
- **Sitting:** Occasionally; while performing classroom duties.
- **Lift/Carry:** Frequently, 1-25 pounds; classroom instructional materials, books, binders, paperwork. For heavier lifting, assistance is available.
- Bending/Twisting: Occasionally: at knees/waist/neck while throughout day.
- Push/Pull: Occasionally, exerting a force of 5-20 pounds; while moving supplies.
- Climbing/Balancing: Rarely; may use step stool.
- **Kneeling/Crouching/Crawling:** Occasionally; may be required while assisting student in physical activities or may occur while restraining student's disruptive behavior.
- Hands/Arms: Constant use of both in reaching/handling/grasping/fingering/gripping
  while performing a variety of physical and administrative duties. Overhead reaching is
  required.
- **Sight/Hearing/Speech:** Constantly; to provide instructional assistance to student. Assignment may require hand/eye coordination, depth perception and peripheral vision depending on assignment.

#### **MENTAL**

- Must possess necessary communication skills, written and oral to complete assignments.
- Must be able to read, write speak English. Possess interpersonal skills to work well with various types of students.
- Must be able to work independently with assigned student(s) and exercise creative problem solving ability.
- Must be able to provide supervisory skills to provide guidance and appropriate behavioral corrections to assigned students.
