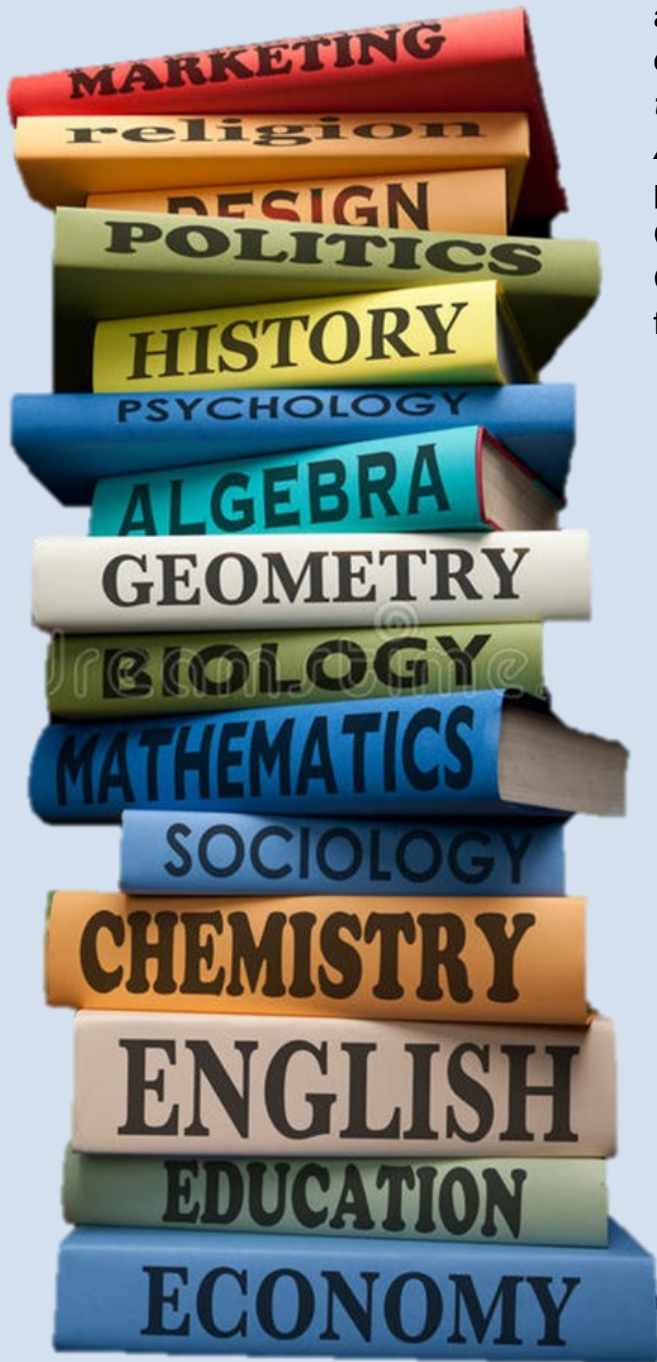


Local Control Accountability Plan Parent Advisory Committee

As the parent or guardian of an Alpine county student, you have the opportunity to shape your school's spending and provide input on school programs and services developed for achievement of all students. **By joining the Local Control Accountability Plan Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)**, you will work with other parents and community members to advise the Alpine County Unified School District Board of Trustees and County Board of Education on issues of concern to families of students in our public schools.

WHAT THE PAC DOES

Actively reach out to communicate with families across the county, to understand and represent parent perspectives about school programs, student services, and other district policy issues

Present recommendations to the District and County boards to support academic achievement among all public school students

Ensure that the District and County board policy decisions are informed by the voices of parents and guardians who represent the District's student populations

How TO BECOME A MEMBER. If you are interested in becoming a PAC member, you must be the parent or guardian of a student enrolled in an Alpine county school, including the Early Learning Center preschool or infant program.

Members of the PAC are expected to attend PAC meetings once a month and participate in any additional preparation time for meetings as needed.
