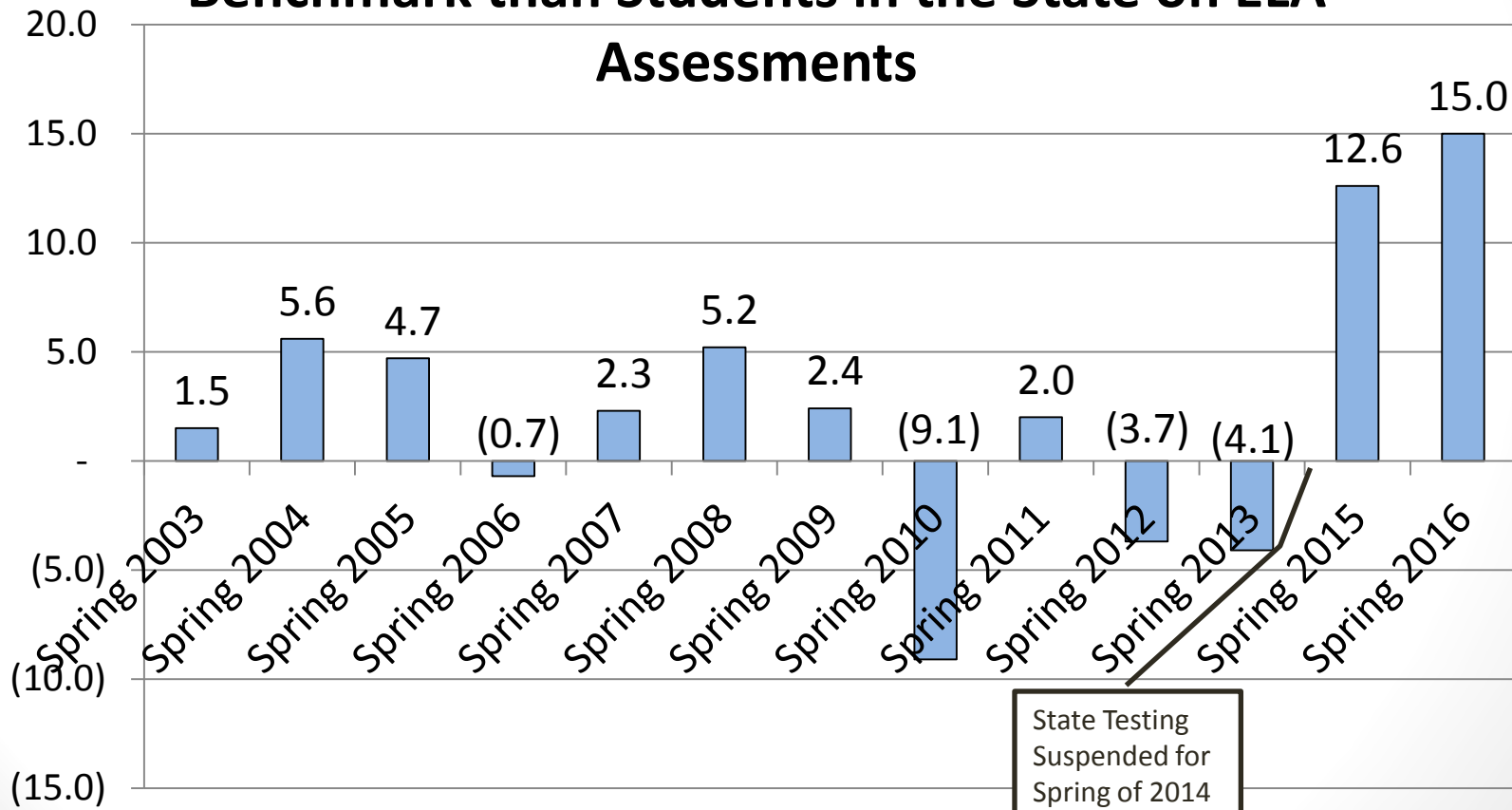

Evaluation on Five State/Federal Goals

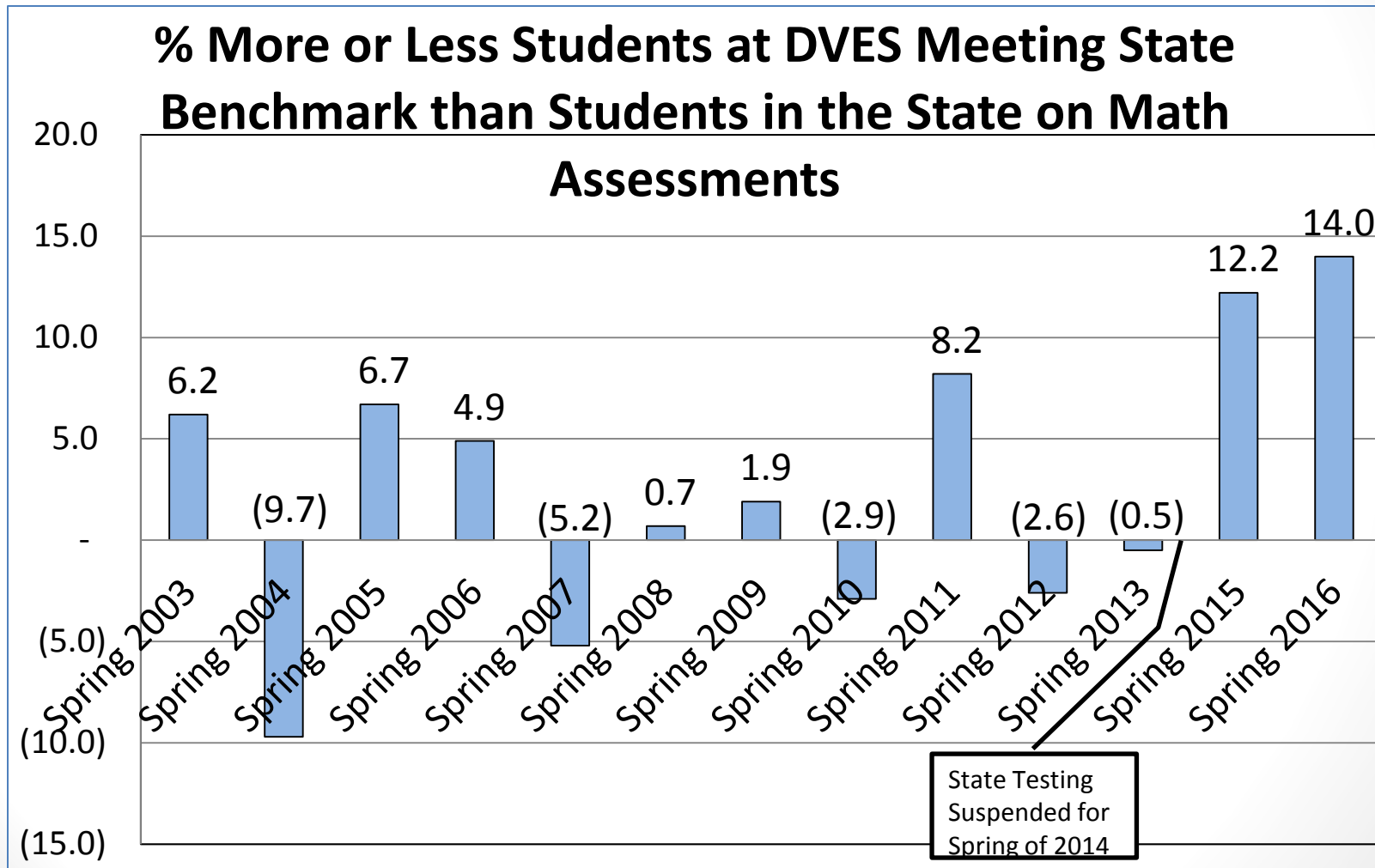
- 1. All students will reach high standards, at a minimum attaining proficiency or better, in reading and mathematics by 2013-2014. **(Student Performance)**
- 2. All limited-English-proficient students will become proficient in English and reach high academic standards, at a minimum attaining proficiency or better in reading/language arts and mathematics.
- 3. By 2005-2006, all students will be taught by highly qualified teachers. **(Highly Qualified Teachers) – 92%**
- 4. All students will be educated in learning environments that are safe, drug-free, and conducive to learning. **(Discipline Data)**
- 5. All students will graduate from high school. **(Graduation)**

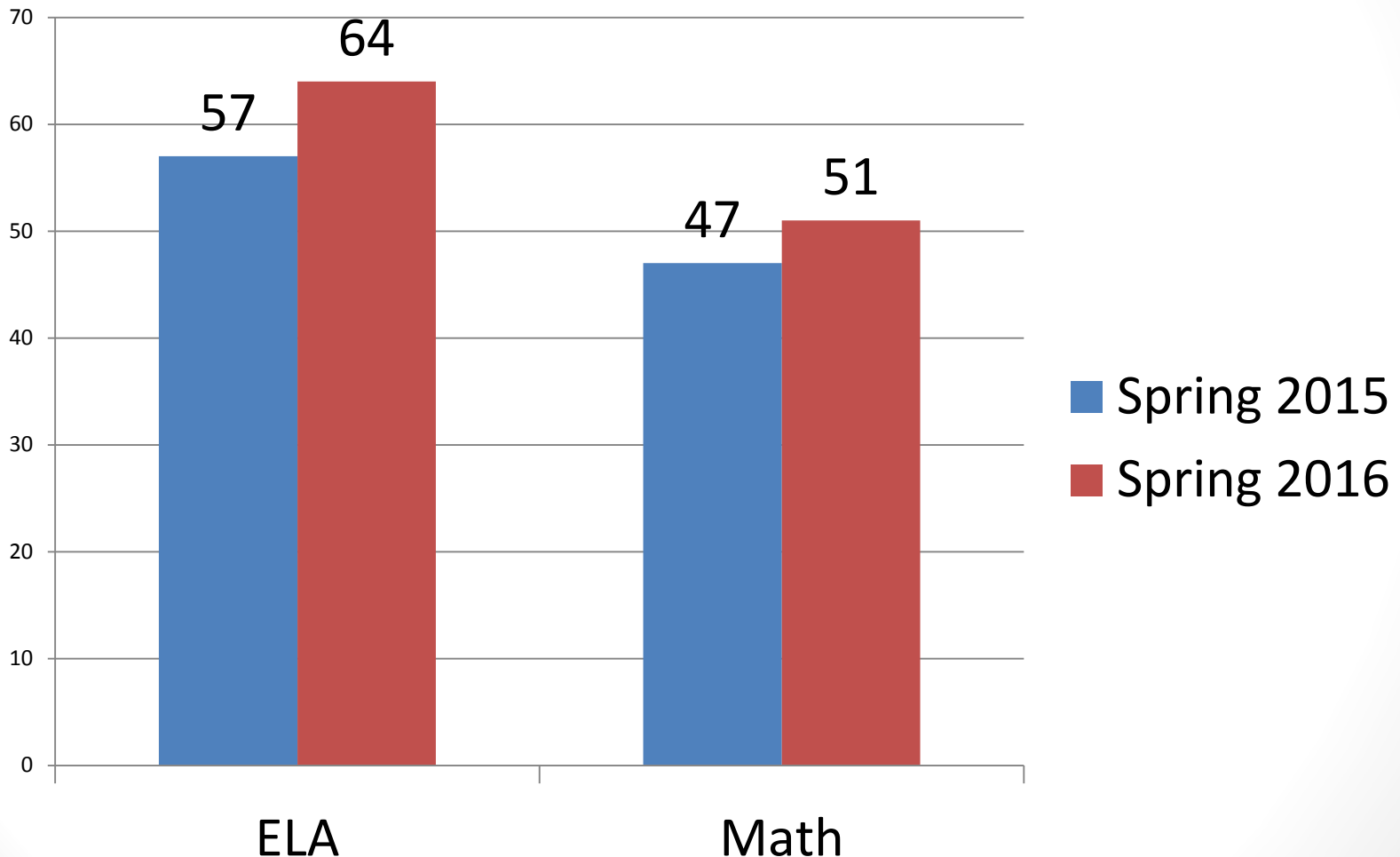
% More or Less Students at DVES Meeting State Benchmark than Students in the State on ELA Assessments



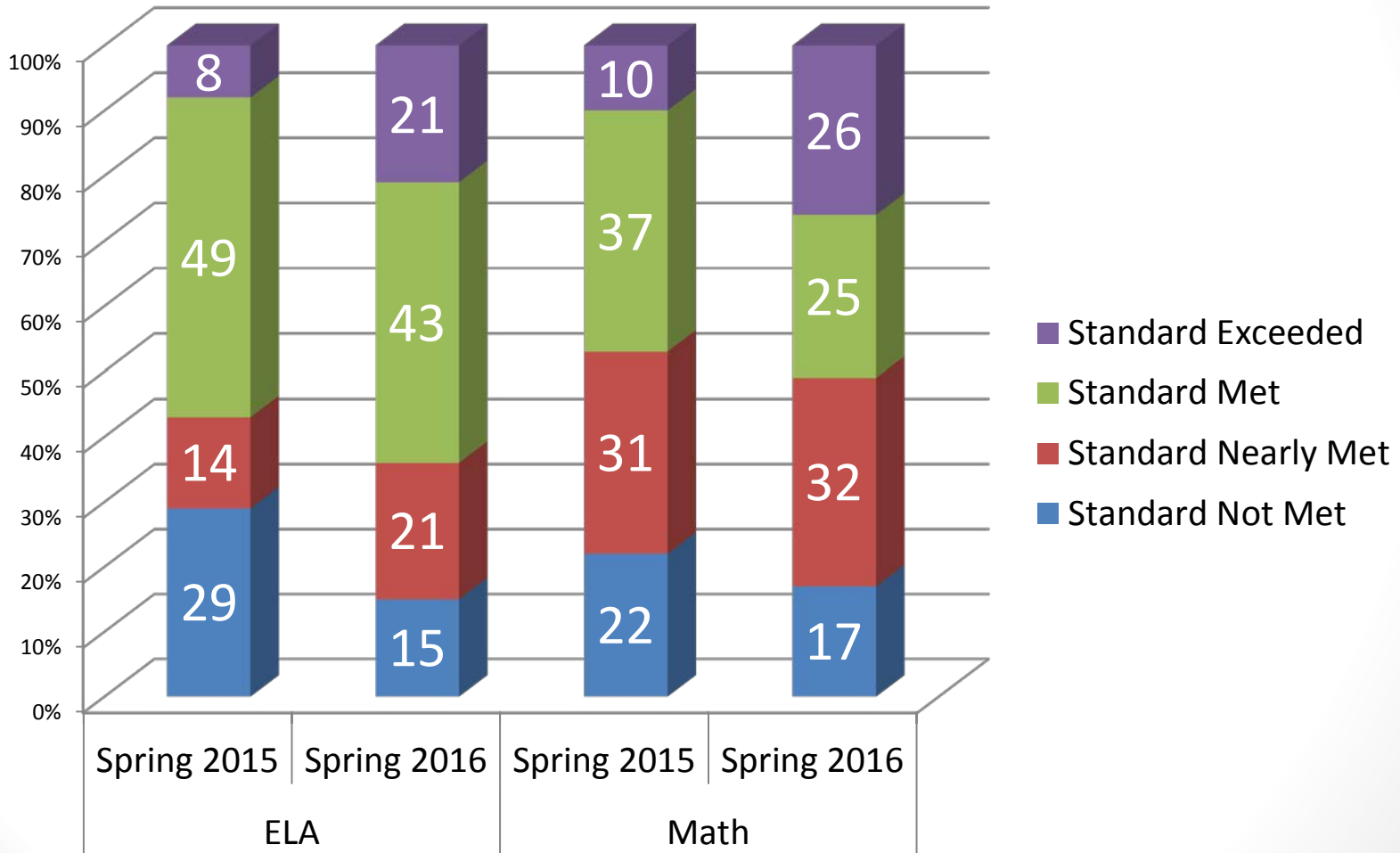
Student Achievement - Schoolwide



Student Achievement - Schoolwide



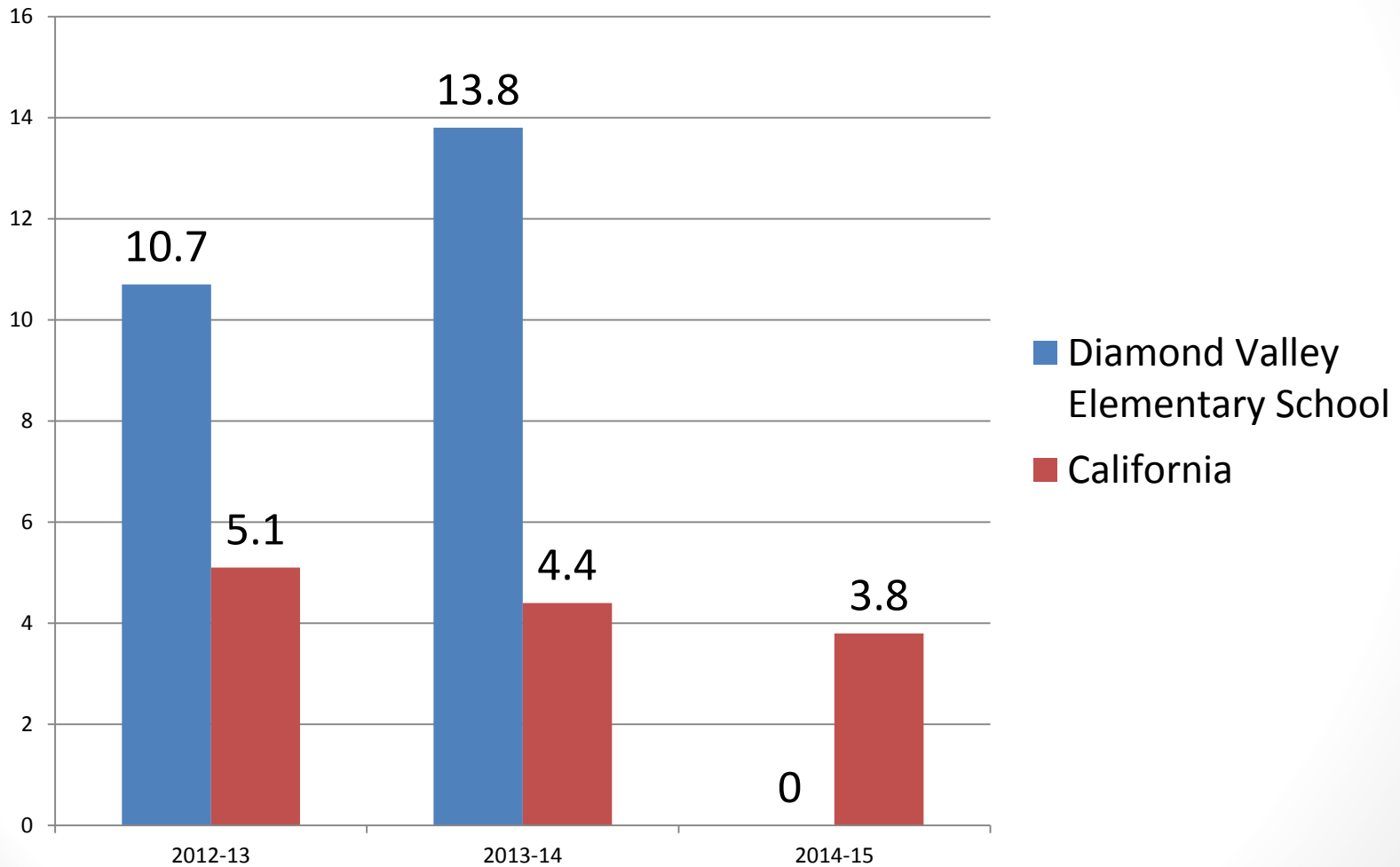
Student Achievement - School Wide
