Dear Alpine County Families,

Our commitment to the safety and wellness of our students, families, and school personnel continues to be our highest priority. To meet that commitment, we will adapt our systems and procedures as needed. The following changes to the food delivery process have been developed to maximize social distancing for our delivery teams and students/families.

These changes to food delivery times will go into effect on Monday, March 23. We appreciate your patience and cooperation.

Independent study packets will continue to be delivered on Fridays at each of the food distribution stops. **Teachers will be contacting students two times per week** (at minimum) and will notify students of the best method for contact outside of those times.

As stated in our previous letter, protecting public health requires a community-wide response. **We need everyone to take social distancing seriously** if we are to achieve the greater benefit of protecting everyone in the County from COVID-19. Alpine County Public Health Officer, Dr. Rick Johnson has declared a Public Health Emergency and the Alpine County Board of Supervisors has issued a Local Emergency. All Alpine County residents are strongly encouraged to stay home, maintain social distancing (6 feet between people) if you must go out, wash your hands and use hand sanitizer if hand washing is unavailable.

This is a dynamic situation where information and circumstances can evolve quickly. We will continue to adapt as needed.
